Application of the Nuclear Energy Act (Confidentiality) Decree

The Ministers of Economic Affairs, Education & Science, Foreign Affairs and Defence,

Having regard to Article 1 of the Nuclear Energy Act (Confidentiality) Decree (Bulletin of Acts and Decrees 1971, 420);

Hereby order:

Article 1

1. The Nuclear Energy Act (Confidentiality) Decree (Bulletin of Acts and Decrees 1971, 420) shall apply to:
 - a. data that are needed to separate various uranium isotopes occurring in fissile material using laser technology and which have not been published in generally accessible publications;
 - b. aids and materials needed to separate various uranium isotopes occurring in fissile material using laser technology from which data as referred to at a. can be derived;
 - c. investigations carried out and procedures applied using data, aids and materials as referred to at a. and b.
2. The Ministers referred to in Article 1 (2) a., b., c. and f. of the Nuclear Energy Act (Confidentiality) Decree may stipulate that (1) shall not apply to one or more persons designated by them.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 16 March 1989.
